Where is this allergen found?

These dyes may mainly use with garments made from polyester or blends of polyester and other synthetic fibers.

How can you avoid contact with this allergen?

Avoid products that list any of the following names in the ingredients:

- Disperse blue 35
- Disperse yellow 3
- Disperse orange 1
- Disperse orange 3
- Disperse red 1
- Disperse red 17
- Disperse blue 106
- Disperse blue 124

What are some products that may contain this allergen?

Garments made from polyester or blends of polyester and other synthetic fibers

Notes:

Disperse red 17 may be used in cosmetics used to dye hairs (INCI name: Disperse Red 17).

Avoid - if possible - wearing polyester garments. Laundry prior to first use may be helpful. If polyester garments are worn, light-colored clothes are safer than dark-colored ones.

Overall, any garments made from cotton, wool, silk or linen are safer than those made from polyester or blends of polyester and other synthetic fibers.

A dietary reduction of nickel may be suggested by your physician.
